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1. CEO Update & Executive Dashboard

ND invited AO to provide her update.

AO provided an update on the work of the charity since the last Board meeting. She drew Trustees attention to the recent media coverage reinforcing the charity's strapline, 'unhealthy, unhappy children don't learn' and the continued decline of children and young people's wellbeing.

AO went on to provide a political update, with specific mention to Youth Sport Trust's (YST) first 100-day engagement plan with the new Government; followed by her attendance at the Labour Party Conference, the YST Fringe involving the School Standards Minister, the Children's Commissioner, the new General Secretary of the Association of School and College Leaders and a member of the YST Youth Board. She also reported back on her attendance at a fringe event run by the Children's Commissioner entitled 'The Big Conversation: Ensuring children's voices are the heart of government policy'.

AO shared with Trustees that the charity had also recently secured an excellent piece to camera recorded by Catherine McKinnell the Schools Minister for the School Sport & Activity Sector Partnership which is convened by the YST.

2. Annual Report and Accounts - Year ended 31 March 2024

In the annual general meeting held just prior to the board meeting, the members approved the annual report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2024.

3. Management Accounts – 2024/25 to August 2024

SSS presented an update to Board on the results to Period 5.

SSS confirmed that a Phased Budget had not yet been completed but will be prepared ready for the next reporting period, however, the surplus at £2,281k is £363k better than last year.

Income is £1.9m above last year due to receiving School Games National Finals income of £2.3m which is part offset by delayed membership invoicing of £205k and Local Government income of £115k.

Cash holdings are down by £560k from 31 March 2024 due to expenditure on deferred projects.

4. Management Accounts – full year forecast

SSS went on to provide an update on the full year forecast.

The current forecast (including strategic investment expenditure) is showing a full year forecast deficit of £1,535k which is £44k better than budget. At the Operational level, the forecast deficit is £684k which is also £44k better than budget as no savings/overspends have been assumed for investment expenditure.

5. Investment Plan Update

SSS presented his update on the strategic investment plan, schedule of spend this year and a summary of the return on investment to date.



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6. Risk Register

AO provided an update on the Risk Register which highlighted how Strategy Risks and Organisational Risks have changed. She reported the emerging education policy changes are reducing the likelihood of schools not wanting to or being empowered to engage in our campaigns, programmes and projects.

7. Diversity and Inclusion Action Plan

The purpose of the paper was to provide an update on the development, delivery and progress of the Diversity & Inclusion Action Plan.

This plan is a requirement for organisations required to conform to Tier 3 of the revised Code for Sports Governance enacted by Sport England and UK Sport.

8. Welfare and Safety

The purpose of this paper was to provide Trustees with an update to ensure transparency and accountability regarding Welfare and Safety [including Safeguarding] at the charity, aligned with our commitment to constant review and challenge.

Trustees were asked to note the content of the paper and recognise the ongoing progress in refining and further strengthening our approach to Welfare and Safety.
